

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

## 2018 SCHNEIDER AWARD

### DR. KATHARINE HAYHOE

Dr. Katharine Hayhoe is an atmospheric scientist whose research focuses on developing and applying high-resolution climate projections to understand what climate change means for people and the natural environment. She is a professor and director of the Climate Science Center at Texas Tech University, and has a B.Sc. in physics from the University of Toronto and an M.S. and Ph.D. in atmospheric science from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Hayhoe served as a lead author for the Second, Third and Fourth U.S. National Climate Assessments. She has also published more than 125 peer-reviewed papers and produces a PBS Digital Studios short series, “Global Weirding: Climate, Politics and Religion.”

Hayhoe has been named one of TIME’s 100 Most Influential People, Foreign Policy’s 100 Leading Global Thinkers and Fortune’s 50 World’s Greatest Leaders. She has also received the American Geophysical Union’s Climate Communication Prize.



### ABOUT THE AWARD

Dr. Stephen H. Schneider was the first member of the Climate One Advisory Council and planned to attend a Climate One event on the day he died in 2010. Shortly thereafter, Climate One founded the annual Stephen H. Schneider Award for Outstanding Climate Science Communication, which recognizes a natural or social scientist who has made extraordinary scientific contributions and communicated that knowledge to the public in a clear and compelling fashion.

The 2018 award jurors were Naomi Oreskes (history of science professor, Harvard University), Ben Santer (climate researcher, Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory) and Cristine Russell (senior fellow, Environment and Natural Resources Program, Harvard University). The jury solicited nominations from a broad spectrum of anonymous experts in the fields of science and communication. The jurors decided that Hayhoe exemplifies the rare ability to be both a superb scientist and powerful communicator in the mold of Stephen Schneider.

### ABOUT STEPHEN H. SCHNEIDER

A pioneering communicator of climate change science, Dr. Stephen H. Schneider is considered one of the founders of climatology. Clearly explaining the effects of climate disruption in many influential papers and forums, he contributed much of the empirically based science that proves climate change is real. Schneider received his Ph.D. in mechanical engineering and plasma physics from Columbia University in 1971. He also studied the role of greenhouse gases and suspended particulate material on climate as a postdoctoral fellow at NASA’s Goddard Institute for Space Studies. The recipient of multiple fellowships, Schneider was elected to the National Academy of Sciences in 2002.

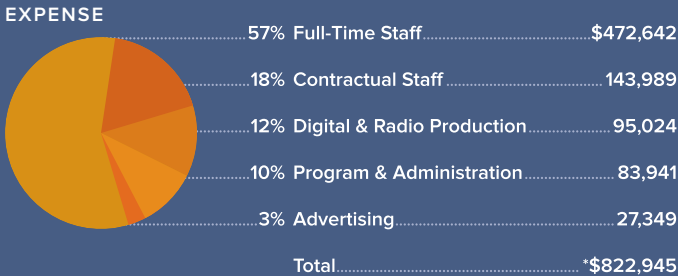
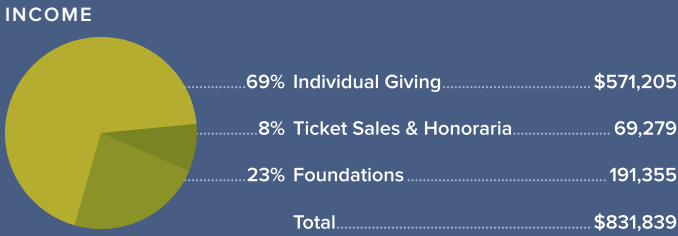
